

### Conservation Commission

The purpose of the Conservation Commission is to promote and develop the natural resources, to protect the watershed resources and to preserve natural aesthetic areas within the Town. The Conservation Commission shall conduct researches into its local land areas and shall seek to coordinate the activities of unofficial bodies organized for similar purposes, and may advertise, prepare, print and distribute books, maps, charts, plans and pamphlets which in its judgment it deems necessary for its work. It shall make and keep an index of all open spaces within the Town in publicly or privately owned, including open marshlands, swamps and other wetlands, for the purpose of obtaining information on the proper use of such areas. It may recommend to municipal councils, boards or agencies, a program for the better promotion, development, utilization or preservation of open areas, streams, shores, wooded areas, roadsides, swamps, marshlands and natural aesthetic areas
